THE QUALIFYING RACES and ENGLISH NATIONAL FINALS

There are five Regional Qualifying Races for teams, leading to selection of teams for the National Finals.

The competition is for <u>TEAM</u> entries only in the following categories:

Category 1 - Stubby gates - Pupils in Years 3-6. Teams of 2 or 3 racers. Separate Boys, Girls & Mixed teams.

Category 2 – Full gates - Pupils in Years 7 and 8. Teams of 3 or 4 racers. Separate Boys & Girls teams.

Category 3 - Full gates - Pupils in Years 9 and 10. Teams of 3 or 4 racers. Separate Boys & Girls teams.

Category 4 – Full gates - Pupils in Year 11 and above. Teams of 3 or 4 racers. Separate Boys & Girls teams.

Category 5 - Full Gates - Mixed Open Teams. Pupils in year 7+ (only). Teams of 3 or 4 racers. One competition. (Team must contain both Girls and Boys. If 4 must be 2 Boys + 2 Girls).

The standard at the Regional Qualifying Races is very varied. This is the perfect entry point to competitive ski-racing for schools and their athletes!

THE ENGLISH OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS AND BRITISH FINALS

The English Open Championships is a separate event, run on the Sunday of Finals weekend. This race also serves as the qualification event leading to selection of teams for the British Finals.

The competition is for <u>TEAM</u> entries in a single Open category for athletes in <u>year 7 and above</u>. There are separate Boys, Girls and Mixed events. As a national competition held using full gates this event is not suitable for athletes in year 6 and below. Mixed team composition rules as for Heats and Finals.





SELECTION FOR NATIONAL TRAINING SQUADS

The results of the Qualifiers, together with those of the Finals and the Open Championships are used to select individual members of our National Training Squads. In 2025 an initial selection of athletes will be made immediately after the Heats, allowing parents longer notice to plan before camps. Additional athletes will be invited on the basis of performance at the Finals and Open Championships.

THE QUALIFYING RACES and ENGLISH NATIONAL FINALS

Teams:

Schools may enter up to TWO boys' and TWO girls' teams in each of the Categories 1-4. There are separate competitions for girls' and boys' teams in Categories 1-4. In addition, they may enter ONE mixed team in Category 1.

Category 5 is designed to allow Schools who could not otherwise raise a Team to still compete. Schools may enter ONE team of athletes in Year 7 and above in Category 5. Teams in Category 5 must comprise a maximum of two athletes of the same sex (BBGG, BGG, GBB are all permitted). In the event that this is impossible, teams with only a single member of the opposite sex to the majority (ie BBBG or GGGB) WILL be accepted, BUT the time of the athlete in the minority will always be counted towards the team result in order to ensure that it is indeed a mixed team (meaning that if the athlete in the minority does not complete a run the team will be DSQ/DNF).

Mixed teams will be able to progress to the National Finals on the Saturday where a Category 5 race will be held in addition to the usual Category 1 to 4 races.

Teams must be made up of pupils from the same school under one Head. All skiers must be genuine full-time pupils on the roll during the Autumn Term of the school they are representing.

No skier may race in two different teams in the Qualifiers, in the Finals or in the Open Championships.

If a Team turns up to race with fewer than the minimum number of skiers, those competitors *will* be allowed to race Hors Concours but *will not* appear on the Results.

Age Group Categories:

Category 1 - Pupils in Years 3 - 6, born 1 September 2014 and later

Category 2 - Pupils in Years 7 and 8, born 1 September 2012 – 31 August 2014

Category 3 - Pupils in Years 9 and 10, born 1 September 2010 – 31 August 2012

Category 4 - Pupils in Year 11 and above, born 1 September 2007 - 31 August 2010

In the event that a pupil is "ahead" or "back" a year in school, their age will take precedence over the year group in which they are currently enrolled in order to determine their category. A team may be made up of school pupils of different ages, but the team will compete in the age group of the oldest skier in the team on the day of the Qualifier. Pupils in Years 6 and under are not allowed to compete in Categories 2 - 5.

Additional Teams: Should any Qualifying Race be undersubscribed consideration will be given to extra entries, which will NOT be eligible for the Finals. Please contact the Race Secretary.





Requests for team changes between Qualifying Races and Finals

Any team taking part in the National Finals should be the same as that which is entered for the Regional Qualifiers.

SUBSTITUTION:

If an athlete named in the entry form is unable to race at the qualifying event (ie Regional Heat or English Open Championships) due to injury or sickness then the team may still race "short an athlete" and the injured athlete will be permitted to resume their place at the Finals should the team progress. Alternatively, a substitute may be nominated. Provided that this nomination is made in writing to the ESSKIA Race Secretary in advance of the qualifying event then, if the team does progress to the Finals, *either* the original athlete *or* the substitute may be named in the team at the Schools discretion.

Requests for other team changes between Qualifying Races and Finals must be submitted in writing as soon as the circumstances giving rise to the request are known, setting out reasons and stating the date of birth and school year of any skier involved. Changes will **only** be permitted in <u>exceptional circumstances</u> at the sole discretion of the Race Committee. A change which would alter the Category of the team would **not** be permitted.

The Race:

The race will consist of two runs over a slalom course. **AS A TEAM-COMPETITION, THE PROHIBITION ON STOPPING / HIKING WILL BE DISAPPLIED.** Category 1 teams will race on stubby gates, Category 2- 5 teams will race using full gates.

Category 1: The team score will be the total of the best two times for each run. If only one skier completes a run, the team will be disqualified. A disqualified team will not be eligible to race in the finals.

Categories 2 - 4: The team score will be the total of the best three times for each run. If less than three team members complete a run, the team will be disqualified. A disqualified team will not be eligible to race in the finals.

Qualification for the National Age Group Finals Race at Norwich on Saturday 11 October 2025:

Provided there are at least two teams which finish in a category at a Regional Qualifier, the winners of that category will qualify automatically for the Finals.

A team is not a winner if the other teams in the category are designated as DNS (Did not Start), DNF (Did Not Finish) or DSQ (Disqualified).

Further places for the Finals will be offered after an evaluation of results at all the Regional Qualifiers. The number of places will not necessarily be the same in every category.

School teachers / team managers will hear from the ESSKIA race secretary within 7 days as to whether their school team has qualified for the Finals in Norwich.





THE ENGLISH OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Open Championship for Girls', Boys' and Mixed Teams are held on the Sunday of our National Finals weekend at Norwich. This is a different race, on a different day, with a separate entry fee from the Age Group races.

Maximum of 2 boys', 2 girls' and 1 Mixed teams per school for pupils in Year 7 and above who have taken part in the Qualifiers. **Note**: it is *not* required that team / Mixed team composition is the same as in the Age Group events held on the Saturday, this is an entirely separate competition, but the same rules apply.

This is also the qualification race for the British Schools' Dry Slope Championships. Any team taking part in the British Finals should be the same as that which is entered for the English Open Championships. The number of places available at the British Dry Slope Championships will vary between categories and will be published following agreement with Snowsport Wales and Snowsport Scotland.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Membership: Schools wishing to enter teams in any of the events must be paid-up current members of ESSKIA.

Officials: It is a **condition of entry** to any of our races that each school must be prepared to provide one Race Official **per team participating in a race**, to be nominated on the Team Entry Form. Full instructions will be given to those officiating, and novice officials will be helped. We operate our Finals using full paperwork appropriate to a national level race. We would be grateful if you can identify any of your proposed officials who hold SSE qualifications.

Attire: Racers must wear suitable protection for arms and legs including long trousers, long sleeve shirt, which must cover the midriff, and gloves.

Helmets: Proper ski helmets must be worn. It is advisable for pupils to wear their own helmet. Slopes have very few to rent/borrow. No cameras, camera mountings, coverings or stickers are allowed.

Bungs on Poles: Under Snowsport England safety rules, competitors must either use the slope's ski sticks, or ensure that their own ones have tip protectors (rubber bungs).

Athletes who present at the startgate without appropriate attire, helmet or without bungs will not be permitted to start.

Sportsmanship: We wish to remind all racers, coaches, parents and spectators that appropriate personal conduct is expected at all ESSKIA events. Whilst a competitive atmosphere is to be encouraged, inappropriate or unsportsmanlike behaviour will not be tolerated and can ultimately lead to sanctions, including suspension from ESSKIA events. Examples of such behaviour include: equipment abuse, swearing, aggressive behaviour, discrimination of any form, heated arguments, disrespect shown to any official or volunteer. All ESSKIA events are "family friendly" environments with appropriate behaviour to be demonstrated at all times.



Fees and Payment

Annual ESSKIA affiliation fee 2025/26:

FOR 2025/26 ONLY, NO ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP FEE WILL BE CHARGED TO SCHOOLS WHICH ENTER THE COMPETITIONS DESCRIBED IN THIS BULLETIN.

Team Entry Fees: £70 per team in Open Competition, and Heats Categories 2, 3, 4 & 5.

£50 per team in Heats Category 1.

If additional teams are added later a new invoice will be generated. Payment details are included on the invoice.

CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES

Membership, application forms, team names and Payment must be made by Thursday 11 September 2025.

Bulletin 2 will then be sent to the school via email after the closing date.

EARLY ENTRIES WOULD BE APPRECIATED, EVEN IF THEY ONLY INDICATE THE NUMBER OF TEAMS REQUIRED WITH ATHLETE DETAILS BEING ADDED LATER but as of this year there is no longer a strict requirement.





ENTRY SYSTEM

- 1. To enter and declare the number of your school teams please go to our race-entry system at https://schoolskiracing.co.uk/esskia.html
- 2. Existing ESSKIA member schools should login using one of the email addresses registered to their account. The email address and password will be the same as the one used last year and for the Indoor Championships (but may be different to that for competitions organised by other organisations managed via the same site).
- 3. Schools seeking to join ESSKIA for the first time should email the Race Secretary: esskia.org for a login and password.



1. Enter / confirm School Details	I agree to abide by the rules of the competition and accept that any decision of the Race Jury is final.
2. Confirm your acceptance of and adherence to ESSKIA Rules	All ESSKIA member schools must have a Child Safeguarding Policy. Each school group attending the races must nominate a Manager, ideally a member of the school staff. If teams are in the sole charge of a nominated Parent Manager, the Head must sign a declaration that the school has complied with normal safeguarding and checking procedures. If all parents are attending then they will be responsible for the safeguarding of their own children. I understand that a Team Manager, who will be present at the race, must be nominated, and that different Race Officials NUST be nominated for each team taking part. The Team Manager may also act as a Race Officials NUST be nominated for each team taking part. The Team Manager may also act as a Race Official for one team. Pupils taking part in ESSKIA races do so at their own risk. ESSKIA, the race organisers, our officials and the venues at which we operate accept no liability for loss, damage or injury to any property or person taking part in or spectating at one of our events.



12. Complete the short online entry form and submit. Your entries will be saved and can be edited any time up to the closing date for the race.






13. Complete your team submission.

Your entries will be saved and can be edited any time up to the closing date for the race. The rules of entry are reiterated at the top of the screen. Rows will turn green to signify that data has been validated against the rules.

Note that during drafting you may have teams which do not fully conform to the rules, or even "empty teams". In order to preserve the data for editing later select the "Details Later" tag.



14. Download copies of your invoice and forms for entry to the Heats. For your convenience these will also be sent to you by email. Send the Invoice to your Finance department and ask them to pay for your entries!





15. Third, enter the Open Championships!

- repeat the entry process, but selecting thre Open Championships.
- complete the form again (the race is on a different day, your details do not need to be the same)
- add senior teams
- submit, download forms and pay for your entries!
